The State of South Carolina } Meajah Berry one of the Justices of the Peace do certify unto all whom it may concern that Margaret Dunbar wife of the within named John Dunbar did this day appear before me and upon being privately and separately examined before me did declare that she did freely and voluntarily without any compulsion dread or fear of any person or persons whomsoever renounce release and forever relinquish unto the within named Asbury Ferry his heirs and assigns all her interest and estate and also all her right and claim of dower of in and to all and singular the premises therein mentioned and released Given under my hand and seal this third day of October A.D. 1823.

²⁴⁶ South Carolina Greenville District Know all men by these presents that I David Devenport of said place for in consideration of the sum of fifteen dollars to me in hand paid by Hewlet Sullivan of said place have granted bargained & sold and released unto the said Hewlet Sullivan his heirs and assigns all that tract of land whereon I now live containing thirty nine acres be the same more or less adjoining Hewlet Sullivan on the north and Thama Chapman on the west and Warren Wappa on the south, originally granted to said David Devenport situated in Greenville District on the waters of Mountain Creek of Saluda River Together
