

The state of South Carolina & This is to certify unto all whom it may concern that I Thomas Long senior have this day for the good will & affection I do bear to my Grand Daughter Amy Henderson Alias Long one Bed and furniture there worth included ten or twelve other pieces of Bed furniture some woller & some Cotton the pieces fully identified by the witness one cow Colled white Back & four head of Sheep (vizt) two Ewes, one lamb & one weather all in my mark also, a Table a some ware both Crockery & glass, which I give & Bequeath freely to her as her right known & given under my hand this 4 July 1824 then acknowledged the day above written Inter lind before assigned Imprisons of George <sup>his</sup> Long  
Michel Robin, mark <sup>3</sup> Thomas Long <sup>33</sup>

South Carolina & Personally came George Long before me an Greenville District & acting Justice for said District and made oath and saith that he saw Thomas Long senior assign and deliver the within deed of gift to Amy Henderson Alias Long for the use and purpose with mentioned and that he also saw the subscribing witness with himself witness the same sworn to before me this 5 day of July 1824

The State of South Carolina, Know all men by these presents,  
that I James Kilgoe of Newberry District in the State aforesaid in consideration of five hundred & fifty Dollars to me paid by Thomas P Brockman of Greenville District in the State aforesaid have granted Bargained, sold and released and by these presents do grant, Bargain, sell and release unto the said Thomas P Brockman his heirs and assigns forever, a certain tract or parcel of land situate lying & lying on the waters of Emore River, commencing at a Post oak on the S. W. side of the Ridge cross road, and running N. 14° E 16<sup>t</sup> ch, to white oak, thence N. 35<sup>t</sup> E. 10. 33. chs. to Post Oak Bush on Henry Brockman, land, thence N. 24° E 25 ch, to stake on said Brockmans land, thence N. 60. W. 45. chs to Post oak on H. Deans land, thence S. 45. W. 25. chs to Black oak & S. 50. W. 12. chs to Hickory on James Pilkings land, thence S. 49. E 94. chs to the Beginning Post oak on James Pilkings land containing two hundred seventy six & one half acre, more or less together with all and singular the Rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances, to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or pertaining to have and to hold all and singular the prem
