Place, of the other part, witnesseth wher as the said Henry Taran-  
rant and Carter Tarrant stand indebted to the said Edmund  
Waddill by of hand bearing ever date herewith in the full  
sum of Two thousand Seven hundred and ninety three dollars  
and fourteen cents Now this indenture witnesseth, that the said  
Henry Tarrant for and in consideration of the said debt or sum  
payable as aforesaid to the said Edmund Waddill and for  
the better securing the payment hereof to the said Edmund  
Waddill according to the natural ~~period~~, and also in consider-  
ation of one dollar by him the said Edmund Waddill  
in hand paid at and before the sealing and delivery of  
of these presents, do grant bargain sell & let in release, con-  
firm and confirm unto the said Edmund Waddill and to his  
heirs and assigns for ever a certain tract or plantation of land  
Lying in the district and state aforesaid on the Golden Grove Creek be-  
ginning on the said Creek at an oak running thence S. 64° E 2.78 chains  
to a Maple thence N. 7.50 E 22 chains to a maple thence S. 64° E  
11.5 chains to a Black Oak thence N. 62° E 110.8 chains to a dogwood,  
thence N. 80° E 24.75 chains to possumine, thence S. 47° E 6.67.
