W. 14 ch to the Beginning including Eighty acres more or less together with all and singular the Rights, members, incidents and appurtenances to the said premises, belonging to or in any wise incident or appertaining To. Have and To Hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the sd. Clark his heirs and assigns for ever the above mentioned land was originally granted to Michel Purkel by a grant bearing date the fifth day of December 1791. Recorded in grant Book D. No. 5. page 248. and we do hereby bind our selves our heirs, Executors and administrators to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the sd. Clark his heirs and assigns against our selves our heirs, Executors and administrators and against all the Claimers of the Legator of <sup>the</sup> sd. William H. Chandler deceased and against every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof to witte, our hands and seals this first day of January one thousand Eight hundred and Twenty five and in the forty ninth year of the Independence of the United States of America signed sealed and delivered in the presence of us
