

dollars to me in hand paid, have given bargained, sold and publicly
delivered, unto my true and worthy friend and connection, James Osborn
Esquire of Puddledon district in the State aforesaid, and Henry Terrell Esquire
of Walton county Georgia, a certain negro Girl Slave named Ally a
bout eighteen years of age and her child Also with them and each of
their future increase, to have and to hold to them and their heirs in trust
for my said wife as long as she may live and at her death to belong to my
said child Amanda, to hold for the exclusive trust and benefit and ad-
vantage of my said wife and child; also all my household Kitchen
furniture to have and to hold for the use and purposes and to keep and
to hold the said negroes in trust alone for the use and benefit of my said
wife and child to permit her and my said child to have use & enjoy-
ment and the said property mentioned for their exclusive use with all -
