Branch to white oak 37.532. 1013 ch. To P. 37 then S. 47. 1018. ch. to pine stump stump on branch of said Creek then down the Meanders of S. Creek to P. 37. 538 E. 35. 50 to P. 37 then S. 20. 75 to Stake 37 then E 47. ch. To pine 37 E. 44. W. 8 ch. to pine 37 N 34. 10. 22. ch. R. 037 then N 43. W. 14. 50 to P. 37 then 20104 60 to black Gum 37 due E. 6 to pine N 64 E. 10. ch. to pine 37. N 81 E 6 ch. to R. 037. 435 103 ch. to B. Gum on the bank of said Creek then up the Meanders of S. Creek to the Beginning including two hundred and twenty one acres to the same more or less to Cetera withal to singular the rights Members hereditaments to the D. premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said Joseph Edwards I do here by bind Myself my heirs Executors and Administrators and for ever defend unto the said Joseph Edwards his heirs and assigns for ever a gainst myself my heirs and against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand And seal this 27th of February 1816 Signed and acknowledged before me Thomas Taylor William Edwards Jesse Morgan Seal

South Carolina Greenville District appeared personally before me this day William Edwards and made the Oath in due form of Law and said he was present and saw Jesse Morgan sign seal and deliver the within deed of conveyance as his act and Deed for the use and purpose therein mentioned also said he was present and that Thomas Taylor was a concurring witness with himself Sworn to and subscribed before me this 31st March 1818 Lynn Walker J.P. William Edwards South Carolina Greenville District by Thos. Forgeson one of the Justices of the Peace for the District of said doe here by certity unto all whom it may concern that Elizabeth Morgan ^{the wife of Jesse Morgan} did this day appear before me and upon being privately and Separately examined by me did declare that she does so voluntarily and without any compulsion dread or fear of any person or persons whomsoever Renounce Release and for ever Relinquish unto the within named Joseph Edwards his heirs and assigns all her interest and estate and also all her right and claim of dower of in or to all and singular the premises within mentioned and Released Given under my hand and seal this the sixth day of June 1820 Thos. Enroad Underwood Sheriff of Greenville district and State of said Land Greeting Whereas by virtue of a writ of fieri facias Issued out of the Court of common pleas held for the Charleston District listed the 28th day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and twenty two at the suit of William Gilliland to me directed commanding me that of the Goods and Chattels lands and tenements of Samuel & Willcox To Levy the sum of Seven hundred & Eighty Eight dollars & sixty Eight Cents damages and costs I have seized and taken of the lands and tenements of The said Samuel & Willcox all that certain piece parcel and tract of land containing five hundred acres more or less situate and being in the Dist.
