Know all men by these presents that we James Goodlett and Willis Goodlett of the district of Spartanburgh and state aforesaid and Alexander Goodlett of the District of Greenville and state aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of four hundred and fifty dollars to us in hand paid by John Howard Goodlett of Greenville District and state aforesaid have bargained sold and delivered unto the said John Howard Goodlett a certain negro boy named Willis a least sixteen or seventeen years of age and we do hereby warrant and defend the said negro boy Willis unto the said John Howard Goodlett his heirs and assigns for ever from all claims and each and every of our heirs and assigns claiming the same or any part of the said negro boy Willis —

The State of South Carolina Know all men by these presents that I Pleasant Moon of Greenville District and state aforesaid for & in consideration of three Hundred dollars to me in hand paid by Hartwell Richard of the state and district aforesaid the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents grant bargain sell & release unto the sd Hartwell Richard a plantation or tract of land situate lying and being in the ~~district~~ and district aforesaid Peter Creek waters of Enoree River it being part of a tract of land originally granted to Sarah Robertson lying on the one side of said tract beginning on a Hickory on the old line thence N. 30. E. 53. chains to a P.O. 3x s. 60. E. 18. to a Post Oak 3x on the N.W. side of a stream thence South until it strikes the stream thence down the meander of it to a white oak 3x at the mouth thence s. 45. w. 4. chains to a Chestnut 3x thence N. 66. w. 2. to a Post Oak 3x thence s. 33. w. 30. 50 to a P.O. stump on the old line thence N. 60. w. 17. 75 to the beginning which includes the land to be conveyed Except half an acre including the ground lying by a late Resurvey one hundred & three acres be the same more or less Together with all and singular the Rights members — hereditaments and appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to the said premises to have and to hold all and singular the above described premises unto the said Hartwell Richard his heirs Exors & admors. I do hereby bind myself my heirs Exors & admors to warrant and forever defend the above mentioned premises unto the said Hartwell Richard his heirs Exors admors & assigns, against my self my heirs Exors & admors and against every other person or persons lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof In witness whereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day of April in the year of our Lord A.D. 1826. and in the fifty first year of American Independence. Signed sealed and acknowledged in presence of (the word Excepting half an acre including the ground mentioned above the fourth line on the opposite side was done before signed)
