 ters tools, three guns, four plows and four pair gears, and one cart, three  
 axes & five hoes Two Chest and Crockery ware five head hogs Eleven head  
 geese and 1 Loom To have and to hold the said property & above named unto  
 the said Hewlet Sullivan his heirs and assigns for ever against myself my heirs  
 and every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof  
 Provided never the less and it is expressly understood that if the said John  
 Camel does pay or cause to be paid the above debt of one hundred  
 dollars by the 25 December next then the above mortgage or bill of sale  
 to be void and of no effect. Otherwise the said Hewlet Sullivan is hereby  
 authorized to take possession of the above named property and proceed to  
 sell the same conformably to law and return the over plus if any

 wise incident or appertaining To have and to hold all and singular the  
 premises a above mentioned unto the said William Hatcher his heirs and assigns  
 for ever And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators to  
 warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said  
 William Hatcher his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and against every per-  
 son whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof Witness  
 my hand and seal this twenty first day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand  
 eight hundred and twenty four and in the forty ninth year of the Independ-
