 day of October in the Year of our Lord one thousand Eight hun-
 dred and twenty six between William Choice Esquire Commissioner of
 the Honorable Court of Equity for Greenville District at Greenville
 Court House in the said State of the one part and William Bates of
 Greenville District and State aforesaid of the other part. Whereas Benja-
 -min McKingie and Zelia McKingie his wife on or about the sixteenth
 day of June A.D 1823. did Exhibit their bill of Complaint in the Court
 of Equity at Greenville Court House in the said State, against Susannah
 Mcbay widow of David Mcbay deceased, Aba May, and Melome his
 wife, Ezekiel Spriggs and Louisa his wife, Robert Cox and Berhaba his
 wife, Susan Mcbay the younger, Ira David Mcbay, Hetturion Mcbay, Chiche-
 -roy Mcbay and Waddy Thompson Mcbay heirs and distributees of the said
 David Mcbay deceased, for partition of the Real Estate of the said David
 Mcbay a man of his heirs and distributees. And the Cause being at issue
 before the Honorable Court came on to be heard at June Term when
 the said Court after full hearing thereof, and mature deliberation in
 the premises did order, adjudge and decree that the said Real Estate
 whereof the said David Mcbay deceased did seized and possessed should
 be sold at public auction by the Commissioner of the said Court
 on the Terms and for the purposes mentioned in their decretal order
 as by Reference thereto in the Registry of the said Court will appear and
 the said William Choice as Commissioner of the said Court after having
 duly advertised the said several Tracts of Land for sale by public
 outcry, on the fifth day of September A.D 1825. did then openly and pub-
 licly and according to the Customs of Auctions, sell and dispose
 of the said tract of Land herein below described unto the said Will-
 -iam Bates for Two hundred dollars being at that price the highest bid
