 and State aforesaid send Greeting; whereas by virtue of a writ
 of Habeas Corpus issued out of the Court of Common Pleas held
 for the district aforesaid tested the twenty fourth day of April
 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
 twenty eight at the suit of Curtis Bradley to me directed
 commanding me that of the goods and Chattels land and ten-
 ements of Henry Langford to levy the sum of one hundred
 and dollar damages and Costs. I have seized and taken
 of the land and tenements of the said Henry Langford all that
 certain piece, parcel and tract of land containing two hund-
 red and twenty five acres more or less situate and being in
 the district of Greenville all that tract or parcel of land
 containing one hundred acres more or less beginning and
 bounding as follows, being and lying on branches of Enoree River
 and north west of said River beginning on a poplar corner
 on the cattle branch adjoining Robert Bensons land thence
 up a glade thence on a conditional line to a station pine
 thence on said line to a pine corner on Henry Langford line
 thence northward along a long a conditional line made by
 John Londrum and Aaron Mincey to a road thence on said
 road until it comes to an old pine stump on the Mill road
 from Henry Langford thence westwardly on Bensons line to a black
 or red oak corner thence to a black and oak corner thence
 down the cattle Branch to the beginning poplar corner
 also an other tract or parcel of land containing of one hundred
 and twenty five acres more or less lying and being situate
