State of South Carolina Know all men by these presents, that I Greenville District William Joney of Greenville District in the State of South Carolina in consideration of the sum of Eighteen hundred dollars to me paid by Jeremiah Cleveland of the aforesaid District and State. Have granted, bargained, sold, and released and by these presents do grant bargain, sell and release, unto the said Jeremiah Cleveland all that tract or parcel of land situate on the Grove Creek containing three hundred and twelve acres more or less being a part of tract of land originally granted to Joseph Brusson by patent bearing date sixteenth day of July (1784) Seventeen Hundred and Eighty four Beginning on a red oak on alleyry Hales line Running thence South 45 chains to a hickory With Brussons corner thence S. 88 1/2 E thirty chains to an ash corner on the west bank of the Grove Creek thence with the creek as it meanders 35 chains to the mouth of a branch thence with the old original bed of the branch 30 chains to an intersection of the back line of the said grant
