

release convey and confirm unto the said Washington Nicoll his heirs and assigns a plantation tract or parcel of land containing two hundred acres more or less situate in Greenville district aforesaid on much Creek of Tyger River, and runs as follows that is to say, Beginning on a stake in the creek thence North nineteen west forty eight chain to a post oak thence North thirty four west seven chain to a red oak thence South eighty three degrees west thirty five chain to a Stake thence South seven degrees East to a Turkey Oak thence Easterly course to a poplar on the still branch thence near the same cause to a Hickory on the bank of the Creek thence down the meander of said Creek to the Beginning together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said Washington Nicoll his heirs and assigns for ever and I do bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said Washington Nicoll his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs Executors or administrators and against all and every other person or persons lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof never the less I retain the privilege of using or attending any of the said lands that I see cause so not as to interfere with his plantation he now tends or may clear during mine or any wife Marys natural life In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this sixth day of September anno Domini thousand eight hundred and thirty. signed sealed and delivered in the presence of us Joseph Barton, ²
