 Colahan of the State and district aforesaid a certain tract of land containing
 by Estimation one hundred and fifty Acres be the same more or less for the sum
 of two hundred dollars to him in hand paid by the said Colahan at or before
 the sealing and delivering of these presents for which payment I the said
 Charles Sotherton do warrant and for ever defend the said land to the said
 Colahan and his heirs for ever. The land lying and being on the head of Gap
 Creek waters of the North Fork of Saluda River and joining to said Colahan's
 plantation whereon he lives beginning on the path leading to the Glaspay
 mountain and running as the path leads to a post oak thence to a Hickory
 thence crossing the main road on top of the ridge and marked on a black
 oak thence on to a forked chestnut this a conditional line then to the south line
 of said Sotherton's tract on the head branches of Tyger thence on the line to said
