This Indenture, made the first day of November in year of our Lord one thousand, eight hundred and thirty two - twin William Choice Esquire Commissioner of the Honorable Court of Equity for Greenville district - at Greenville Court House in the said State, of the one part - and David J. Goodlett of Greenville District of the other part -
 Whereas, Alexander Mathis Orpha his wife, Alfred Merritt and Ezekiel Merritt on or about the eleventh day of May A.D. 1829 did Exhibit their Bill of Complaint in the Court of Equity at Greenville Court House in the said State, against Sarah Merritt Willaw, Melinda Merritt, Ezekiel J. Salmons and Nariipa his wife, William H. Talley and Elizabeth N. his wife, James J. Merritt Elmira B. Merritt and Hiram W. Merritt Heirs at law of the said Wheaton Merritt deceased, stating among other things that the said Wheaton Merritt departed this life in the year Eighteen hundred and twenty seven in testate, seized and possessed of a valuable Real Estate, and prayed that partition might be made of the real Estate of the said Wheaton between his heirs at law equally with their rights and the Cause being at issue before the Honorable Court came on to be heard at last July Term when the said Court after full hearing thereof and mature deliberation in the premises did order adjudge and decree that the said Real Estate of the said Wheaton Merritt should be sold at public auction by the Commissioner of the said Court on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in their decretal order, as by Reference thereto, in the Registry of the said Court will appear and the said William Choice as Commissioner of the said Court after having duly advertised the said lands for sale by public outcry on the said first day of November first above mentioned, did then openly and publicly, and according to the Custom of Auctions, sell and dispose of the said Tract of Land below described unto the said David J.
