Greenville District ³ day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty two between John

Watson ordinary of the district aforesaid and Dr Thomas P. Williams of the same State and district. Whereas a sum in my power to convey or sell a certain tract of Land hereinafter described of the estate of John Gordon late of this tract aforesaid deceased found from the court of probate of said estate and upon the return thereof of the judge of said court in which it was held could not be divided without injury to the interest of myself. Therefore I do order the same to be sold by the sheriff of the district aforesaid for a credit of years. Whereupon the Sheriff aforesaid did advertise in a publick place for sale on the first Monday in December A.D. 1831. And whereupon the Sheriff aforesaid did on the said day expose to sale at publick outcry on the credit aforesaid the said land and when Dr Thomas P. Williams was was the last and highest bidder to whom the said land was struck off for the sum of one hundred and twenty one dollars. Now this indenture will witness that in consideration of the sum of one hundred and twenty one dollars to me paid or secured to be paid I have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant my bargain sold and released to the said Dr Thomas P. Williams his heirs and afflites forever all that tract of Land situate in the district and state aforesaid on Brushy creek of Rude river and hath such bounds marks & boundaries as are described in two deeds of conveyance copyed over from Obadiah Baldwin to the said John Gordon aforesaid for one hundred and fifty acres bearing date the 4 day of March A.D. 1820. The other from James West to said decessor for one hundred and fifty acres bearing date the 19 day of December A.D. 1818 the aforesaid tracts being adjoining each other and contains in all three hundred acres by the dimensions or lines with the appurtenances therunto belonging of land.
