four hundred and fifty seven dollars to me paid by Rubin Edellock
of Greenville District and State aforesaid have granted, bargained, sold and
released and by these presents do grant bargain, sell and release unto the said
Rubin Edellock all that plantation or tract of land containing one
hundred and thirteen acres (more or less), situate in the District of Greenville
and State aforesaid lying on the waters of Mountain Creek, beginning
at a hickory 34 and running thence S 36 E 41.50 to a small hickory 34
bound by Joseph Edellock's land, thence S 47 W 40.50 to a rock 34
bound by Nathaniel Gains land, thence N 47 W 18.25 to a rock 34
thence N 13 E 38.25 to the beginning, bounded by John Edellock's land
together with all and singular the rights in me, hereditaments, and
appurtenances to the same belonging, or in any wise incident or
pertaining thereto and singular the said premises unto the
said Rubin Edellock his heirs and assigns for ever And I do hereby bind
myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and for ever defend
all and singular the said premises unto the said Rubin Edellock his heirs
and assigns against myself and my heirs, and against every other person
whosoever lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof witness
my hand and seal this the second day of January in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty six George French

both Carolina Personalty came before me the subscribing Justice
of Greenville District Nathaniel Gains and made oath, that he saw George
