 and being in the District of Greenville and State aforesaid on both sides of south the
 Pickonet Beginning on a small black oak or corner agreed on, on the east
 side of my land and a few rods east of the groves, thence N. 15 W. 20 75. to
 a pine, thence N 75 E 10. crossing) pacchette to a post oak, thence N 10 E 10
 to pine, thence S 80 W 10. crossing the black house branch to a stump,
 thence S 42 W 24 to a post oak, thence S 47 E 11. 50 to a chestnut said
 Whittens corner, thence S 43 W 13. with Whittens line and crossing) the
 branch to a small black oak, agreed on, thence N. 86. E. by an apple tree
 station, and near the old house 20 75. to the beginning containing by
 estimation forty one acres, be the same more or less, it being a part
 of and the north end of the tract of land I live on and was granted to
 Aaron Short the 25th Sept 1791 believed to have been conveyed by Short to
 Robert Goodgion by Goodgion to David Barnell, by Barnell to Whitten
 Whitten, and by the said Whitten to me Together with all and
