Wm. Langley (District of Columbia)

The undersigned William Langley wishing to

become a citizen of the United States respectfully refers himself in due  
obedience to an act of Congress respecting the naturalization of foreigners & he  
was born in Brunswick Germany under the allegiance of the King of Prussia  
on the day of February in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and  
thirteen that he left Brunswick in Germany for the United States in June  
of the year Eighteen hundred and thirty four that he landed in Baltimore in the  
month of same year and shortly afterwards came to South Carolina with the intent  
of becoming a citizen of the same that it is now and has been his intention  
to release all Allegiances which he may owe to any Foreign Prince, State  
or State whatsoever & especially to the King of Prussia within whose dominions  
he was born and live & till his removal to the United States Sworn to  
and subscribed this September 21<sup>st</sup> 1838
