 Greenville district } the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred
 and thirty eight between John Watson Ordinary of the district aforesaid and
 Elijah Dill of the same State and district Where as a summons in partition
 to Divide or sell a certain tract of Land hereinafter mentioned or descri-
 bed, of the Estate of Stephen Dill deceased issued from the Court of ordina-
 ry of said District and upon the return thereof the Judge of said Court
 did determine that the said land could not be divided without injury
 to the interests of the parties and did order the same to be sold by the Sheriff
 of the district aforesaid on a credit of twelve months, Whereupon the
 Sheriff aforesaid advertise the said Land for sale on the first Monday
 in May 1838 And whereas the Sheriff aforesaid did on the said day
 expose to sale at public outcry the said land when George W. Dill was
 the last and highest bidder, to whom the said land was struck off
 for the sum of two hundred and one dollar which purchase was
 transferred by the said George W. Dill to the above mentioned Elijah Dill
 Now this indenture witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of two
 hundred and one dollar to pre-paid I have granted bargain or sold
 released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release to the
 said Elijah Dill his heirs and assigns forever all that tract of land
 on which the said Stephen Dill did live at the time of his death
 Situate in said district on Fortunesberry's Beaverdam Creek of
 Middle Sycor River containing one hundred and sixty acres
 more or less adjoining Lands of Edward Stewart Milton Ponder
