

This Indenture made this the twenty ninth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine between Reuben Redman of South Carolina and District of Greenville of one part and John West of the same State and place of the other part Witnesseth that the S^d. Reuben Redman for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars to him in hand paid by the S^d. John West the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged he the S^d. he hath bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell to the S^d. John West a certain tract or piece of land containing by estimation two hundred acres lying and being in Greenville District on banks Brushy Creek it being a part of a tract of land originally granted to Paul Abner, grant bearing date 1st January 1783 and also a part of a tract originally granted to Baron Kemp Grant bearing date 3th January 1795 and deced'd from Baron Kemp to the S^d. Reuben Redman beginning on a Red Oak corner running thence a straight line to the head of Rainey branch down S^d. branch to a stake corner on Rainey line thence a long S^d. line to a Post O. and thence a straight line Brushy Creek thence down S^d. Creek to the mouth of Bigly thence up S^d. branch to a black oak corner thence a straight line to the beginning corner which S^d. tract of land of two hundred acres be the same more or less with all and singular of its appurtenances the S^d. R. Redman doth from himself and his heirs and from all and every ^{persons} and persons will release and forever defend to the S^d. John West his heirs and assigns for ever in Witness whereof the S^d. R. Redman hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his Seal the day and date above written.
