To the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas &
 General Sessions for Greenville District — I William Rabe an alien do hereby
 Certify that it is bona fide my intention to become a citizen of the United States
 that I was born in Breslaw in the Kingdom of Prussia on the 15th of April
 in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and Eighteen — That he
 is now twenty One years of age and owed allegiance to the King of Prussia
 by birth and to the King of France by residence when he sailed for the United
 States — that he left Rotterdam in Holland on the 15 of September Anno Domini
 1837 and landed in Baltimore on the first of November ensuing that he immediately
 afterwards came to South Carolina with an intention of residing here
 and now reports himself to the Clerk of the Court of Greenville District in
 conformity with the act of Congress regulating the naturalization of Foreigners
 and with a view of becoming a citizen of the United States — This October 10th
 in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and thirty nine —
