 In Obedience to an act of Congress prescribing the mode of Naturalization the undersigned William John Mc Clevey respectfully reports to the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas for Greenville District South Carolina that he was born in the Province of Ulster Ireland within the Kingdom of Great Britain on the Eighth day of November Anno Domini Eighteen hundred and five and giving allegiance to the King of Great Britain - that he sailed from the City of Belfast Ireland for the United States on the 28th Oct^r 1835 and landed in the City of Charleston on the fourth of December following. That he is now thirty five years of age and is desirous of becoming a citizen of the United States with the view of residing in the same Sworn to and subscribed this 17th day of June 1840

South Carolina; To all whom to whom these presents shall come I David Humming Sheriff of Greenville District and State aforesaid send Greeting Whereas by virtue of sundry writs of fieri facias issued out of the Court of Common Pleas held for the District of Greenville tested the ninth day of March in the year of Our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and thirty Nine at the suit of Lewis Gibson &c. and others to me directed commanding me that of the goods and chattels lands and tenements of Joseph Powell to levy the sum of Five thousand six hundred dollars damages and costs I have seized and taken
