by lands of Geo Dill, David Jackson, & others containing five hundred  
acres more or less. Together with all and singular the Rights, Mem-  
bers Hereditaments and appurtenances to one Twelfth part of the  
said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining

To Have and To Hold all and singular the premises before  
mentioned unto the s<sup>d</sup> Massey Jackson his heirs and assigns forever

And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and Admin-  
istrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the  
said premises interest unto the said Massey Jackson his heirs  
and assigns against me and my heirs and against every other  
person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or  
any part thereof: Witness my hand and seal this 15<sup>th</sup> day  
of April in the year of our Lord 1841 and in the Sixty fifth  
Year of the Independence of the United States of America
