 all and singular the premises within mentioned

 4th day of January Anno Domini 1843.

Susannah Stokes Deed for maintenance &c

To
 Singleton Stokes of South Carolina & know all men by
 Greenville District & these presents that
 I Susannah Stokes widow of the late Henry Stokes dec'd of
 the State District aforesaid have covenanted and agreed
 with Singleton Stokes my son in Law of the State District
 aforesaid, to transfer unto him his heirs of all my right
 title & interests, both real & personal of the estate of the
 said Henry Stokes dec'd consisting of one thirds part of
 the said estate &c. do hereby sell & forever relinquish unto
 the said Singleton Stokes all right title & interest to the
 same &c. do hereby authorize the administrators & the
 Ordinary of said District to pay all such sums of money
 as should be coming to me to the said Singleton Stokes
 and his receipt will be a sufficient discharge for the
 same. The conditions of the above transfer is as follows,
 that he the said Singleton Stokes on his part doth covenant
 and agree to board and clothe the said Susannah Stokes
 & give her comfortable lodging for the remainder of her life
 and to take care of her in sickness & in health so long
 as she may live, and failing to do so she can bring
 a suit against him the said Singleton Stokes make
 him account for all sums of money he has received
 and after deducting what would be right for her
 maintenance for the time he has thus supported
 her, she shall be bound to pay over the remainder with-
 -out delay to the said Susannah Stokes. but should
 the said Singleton be able, to make it appear that
