


Alexander Jones Tempus Jones and Elizabeth Marshall, all of the State of Tennessee and County of Lincoln, having for diverse good causes and considerations as hereunto moving, nominated made constituted and appointed, and by these presents do nominate, make constitute and appoint James Marshall of the County and State aforesaid, our true efficient and lawful attorney in fact for us and in our names, places, rooms and steads, to act for demand receive and receive for all money goods & chattels debts and demands that may be due, or may become due to us from the Estate of Dennis Marshall deceased late of the State of South Carolina and District of Columbia, and moreover to do any thing or things act or acts relative to receiving and settlements with the Executors or administrators of said Estate or any other person having any concern with the premises and may appear if necessary in the person by giving of them power of Attorney to transact any of the above business and also to do any thing relative to such settlements that we in our proper persons could do here we personally present to the business in what part of the United States that it may.
