Deed of Sale for 195 acres of Land

State of South Carolina } This indenture made this Greenville District } second day of May in the Year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Forty two between John Watson ordinary of the District aforesaid and Oliver Simpson of the same State and District, It hereas a writ of Summons to divide or sell a certain tract of Land therein after described of the estate of Henry Stokes late of said District, deceased issued from the Court of ordinary of said District, and upon the return thereof the Judges of said Court did determine, that the said Land could not be divided without injury to the interests of the parties and did order the same to be sold by the Sheriff of the District aforesaid on a credit of Twelve months. It hereupon the Sheriff aforesaid did advertise the said Land for sale on the first Monday in March A.D. 1842. And when so the said Sheriff aforesaid, did on the said day propose to sale at public outcry in the Court aforesaid the said Land, when the said Oliver Simpson was the last and highest bidder, to whom the said Land was struck off for the sum of Four hundred and twenty dollars. Now this indenture witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of Four hundred and twenty dollars to me paid and secured to be paid, I have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release to the said Oliver Simpson his heirs and assigns forever, all that tract of Land situated in said District on both sides of Monrovia of Enoree river, adjoining lands of Joseph Carre's Carre's Creek and others containing One hundred and Ninety five acres more or less and hash such bounds, marks re as follows: By beginning at a Pinnacle on the N.
