Beginning on a W. C. 3x on Bigby branch, Thence S. 52. E. 9. Chs to a Rock 3x. Thence S. 20. E. 17 Chs to a Sp. C. 3x. Thence W. 30 E. 13. 50. to a white Oak 3x on the spring branch, thence down said branch the meanders thereof to Brushy Creek. Then up the meanders of the said Creek to the mouth of said Bigby branch Thence up the meanders of the said branch to the beginning.
