This tract or parcel of Land is lying on the North Side of Canon River on the waters of Lick Creek, Beginning on a Black Gum Corner, joining Lands of the Widow Crowder and Ethel Helzelaw, thence running North 55 W. 50 Chains to a Stake corner joining Lands of Peter Cault. Thence N. 55 E. to a pine corner, joining lands of Harpur and Edward Bridwell thence with said Bridwell line to a Post Oak Corner, thence with said Bridwell line to a white Oak corner on the bank of Lick Creek joining Calvin Curney. Thence down the meanders of said Creek to the widow Crowders line, thence with said line to the Beginning corner, containing two hundred acres more or less, Together with all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining, To have and To hold, all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Thomas Taylor his heirs and assigns forever.
