relinquish unto the within named Thomas, Cox his heirs & assigns
all her interest & estate, and also all her right and claim of Power
of use or to all and singular the premises within mentioned & released,

I, William Mason of the District & State aforesaid
in consideration of the sum of seventy two dollars
to me in hand paid by Mathias J. Hudson of the aforesaid State &
District, have granted, bargained, sold & released and by these presents
have bargained sold & released unto the said M. J. Hudson a certain
tract of land situate in the District aforesaid on Rocky Creek, waters
of Enoree River it being part of a tract of land originally granted
to Abraham Hudson Decd and hath such parts & Co. as follows,
commencing on a Red Oak on Sanford Hudsons line, thence running
North to a Spanish Oak, from thence to the Creek and thence running
up said Creek to the fork and from thence up to the north fork to
Abraham Hudsons old corner in the glade and from thence south line
to a Stake corner on Sanford Hudsons line and from thence along
said line to the Beginning corner containing twenty four acres more
or less, together with all and singular the rights members heredita-
ments and appurtenances to the said premises belong or in any
wise incident or appurtenant, To have and to hold, all and
singular the premises before mentioned unto the said M. J. Hudson
his heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind myself, my
heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend
all and singular the said premises unto the said M. J. Hudson
his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs & against every
other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same
or any part thereof Witness my hand & Seal this the 6th day
