

trustee should be put to our dollar expenses or to any great trouble in the management of the said Trust he is therefore likewise empowered by this deed to pay all necessary expenses that he may incur in the management and discharge of his duty as trustee aforesaid out of the proceeds of the labour of the said Slaves and the labour of their increase and he is at liberty to retain the usual commissions in the event of his having to sell the said slaves on the happening of the contingency above specified which authorizes a sale. The possession of the said Slaves by my said daughter during her life as aforesaid is not intended to effect in any manner the legal title of the said James M. Sullivan to the said Slaves which is hereby fully vested in him for the uses & trusts above declared and set forth, nor on the said Slaves or their increase to be removed beyond the limits of the said state without an order for that purpose first had & obtained from the Court of Equity. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand the 7th day of January in the year of our said one thousand eight hundred forty three and in the sixty seventh year of American Independence. Signed sealed and delivered in the presence of us having been first interlined in one place with the word "surviving" and in another with the word "Slaves" and an erasure and Prof "Isaac" Fountain inserted.

Westmoreland his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of Land containing thirty acres more or less, adjoining lands of St. Springfield. Beginning on a post oak, running eastward to the head of the Spring Branch, down the meander of the branch, to the creek, thence up the creek to the old wagon
