He shall do him no damage, nor see it done by others without giving him notice, but in all things behave himself as a faithful apprentice ought during the said term. The said David G. Westfield shall use the utmost of his endeavours to teach or cause the said Laurence to be taught in the aforesaid business of a Blacksmith. He shall and will also find and allow him meat, drink, washing, lodging and apparel fit and convenient for such an apprentice during the aforesaid Term. He shall in addition thereto make provision to pay the charges for three months schooling during the said term of an apprenticeship. For the true performance of the above agreement the parties bind themselves each unto the other firmly by their presents. In Witness whereof the said parties have hereunto set their hands and seals, dated in Greenville this 16th day of May 1843. His term will expire on the 16th of April 1850 at which time the agreement will be void -

Foster Junior of Greenville District in the State aforesaid have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, and release unto the said R. S. C. Foster Jr, all that parcel or tract of land situated, lying and being in the District and State aforesaid on the head waters of Enoree and Needy Rivers, containing one hundred acres more or less, being the plantation whereon Sally Montgomery formerly lived, and bounded as follows. Beginning at White corner a post oak, thence on his line running S. 17. W. to a corner Red and Spanish oaks, near the main road Phillips corner thence N. 80. E. to a Chestnut corner on Bennies line thence N. 6. W. to Phillips line, thence on Phillips line to a pine corner thence along Batons line to a light wood Stake thence along Batons line to a red oak
