 Joseph McMillin Sen } Johnson of the District & State aforesaid  
 for and in consideration of the sum of one  
 hundred and seventy dollars to me in hand paid by Joseph Mc  
 Millin Sen of the State aforesaid & District of Spartanburgh have  
 bargained sold and released, and by these presents, do grant, sell  
 and release to the said Joseph McMillin a certain piece or parcel  
 of my land and plantation whereon I now live, viz, all that part  
 which lies on the north or upper side of the waggon road run-  
 ning from Fews bridge to Greenville Court House; reference being  
 had to my deed for the same bounded by south Tyger River, said  
 Bailey and others, together with all and singular, the rights, man-  
 ners and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any  
 wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold, the said  
 premises to him & his heirs forever, and I do hereby warrant  
 & forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said  
 McMillin, his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs  
 executors and administrators and against every other person or  
 persons who should lawfully claim or to claim the same  
 or any part thereof. Now the condition of the above deed or  
 mortgage is such that if the said Isaac Johnson does by  
 the first day of January one thousand eight hundred forty  
 four pay or cause to be paid unto the said McMillin the  
 said sum of one hundred Seventy Dollars as well as the  
 interest due thereon then the said deed or mortgage shall  
 be null and void, otherwise to remain in full force & virtue.
