The State of South Carolina²¹⁶

Know all men by these presents that I, James Harper of Charleston in the aforesaid State in consideration of twelve hundred dollars to me paid by James Mays of Greenville District in the State aforesaid, have granted, bargained, sold and released and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said James Mays a certain tract or parcel of land situate in the District of Greenville and State aforesaid on South Tyger River containing two hundred and fifteen acres be the same more or less, it being the same tract of land on which the said Harper lately resided and hath such bound marks &c. as follows, viz. Beginning at a Dead Dogwood 3x at the entrance of Beaver Slaw Creek into South Tyger River, thence up the meanders of said Creek to the mouth of a ditch thence with said ditch to the present Causeway and bridge on said Creek to a Stake (formerly a Black Gum 3x, on the north side of said Creek, thence North 83^o W. 14 Ch, to a Stake & pointers near said Creek, thence N. 6. E. 30. 25 Ch, to a Stake on a road near the residence thence by said road 32 Ch, to a post oak 3x on said road thence N. 11 E. 18. 70 Ch, to a small hickory 3x. Thence N. 60 E. 11. 50 Ch, to a Stake on said River thence down the meanders of said River to a P.O. 3x. Thence S. 41. E. 11. 50 Ch, to a Red Oak 3x. thence N. 71. E. 1 Ch, to an Oak 3x. on the bank of said River. thence down the meanders
