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Know all men by these presents that I, George Cox of Greenville District and State aforesaid, for in consideration of the sum of Eight Hundred and sixty dollars to me in hand by William Cox of Greenville District and State aforesaid, have granted, bargained, sold and released and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said William Cox a plantation, tract or parcel of land containing one hundred acres be the same more or less, situated on the North bank of Saluda River, being the lower end of the plantation or tract of land whereon Har- mond Gibson formerly lived which he conveyed to Charley Coulter on the 29th day of March in the year of our Lord 1797 agreeable to the lines of the said tract of Land as divided by the said Harmond Gibson and Charley Coulter there being a certain line extended in a straight course from line to line of the said land the said line running from a certain black post standing in the lane thence to post oak and with the direction of the said conditional line to the outlines of said land the lower or S.W. end of said tract of land agreeable to the old lines together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or anywise incident to have and to hold
