


split the three chains in width having the said Turnpike for its center line; but when said Turnpike crosses directly through the improvements made by said Wilson Barton, the said Superintendent reserves as aforesaid, only the fifty feet of Road - surface and side-ditches - said tract having such firm marks and bounds as by reference to the plat hereunto attached will more fully appear. Together with all and singular the Hereditaments, Rights, Members and Appurtenances, whatsoever, to the said tract of Land belonging or in any wise appertaining, To have and To hold, all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Wilson Barton his heirs and assigns forever, in as full and ample manner as the said State now holds and enjoys the same.
