presente, that I, Hiram Dill of the one part, in consideration of the sum of One Hundred to me paid in hand by John Langley of the other part both in the State and District aforesaid, having entered, bargained, sold and delivered and released unto the said John Langley all and singular a plantation or tract of Land containing Eighty-five Acres be the same more or less situated in the said District on oil camp Creek bounded on the West by John Willisons land and on the East side by John Gililand land beginning at a large Spruce pine on the No. side of the Creek thence to a large Rock called the Bare horse from thence to a white walnut station thence up the middle of sd ridge to the North line of the original survey thence No. 65 East to a pine S. 8. W. 24. 91 links to a stake 25 West to a gum 57 West x 23 to a certain ridge to a poplar 3 x at the head of a branch thence down sd branch to the middle of the Creek maple 3 x thence down the middle of sd creek to the beginning together with all and singular the premises before mentioned unto sd John Langley and his heirs forever and I do bind myself and my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and defend the above mentioned tract of Land unto the sd John Langley his heirs w aforesaid being the same 85 acres more or less given under my hand and seal this 25 August. 1844.

This Indenture, Made the Seventeenth

day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, between John Mc Leland, Superintendent of Public Works of the State aforesaid, of the one part, and Jonathan Ward, of the other part:
Whereas, The General Assembly of the State aforesaid, on the nineteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, passed an Act, entitled, "An Act to authorize the Superintendent of Public Works to dispose of certain lands belonging to the State," by which Act the said Superintendent is authorized and directed to sell at Public Auction, to the highest bidder such lands as are connected with the Public Works, and not necessary thereto, belonging the State, at such time and places as he may deem fit,
