

deed aforesaid, in consideration of six hundred & twenty-nine dollars to me allowed, by my son Hewlet Chapman out of his share of my estate, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by presents do grant, bargain sell and release unto the said Hewlet Chapman all that tract of Land whereon the said Hewlet Chapman now lives, in the waters of the Golden Grove Creek, containing two hundred and ninety acres, more or less, beginning on the N. E. corner of the N. 4 1/2 W. 42. 50 ch. to a white oak 3 x 4 1/2 W. 46 ch. to a stake 3 x thence N. 43 W. 41. 50 ch. to a cypress 3 x thence S. 35 W. 9. 50 ch. to a Hickory 3 x thence S. W. 21. 25 ch. to a white oak 3 x on a branch, thence up said branch S. 80 E. 9. 19 ch. to a Rock 3 x thence S. 44 W. 19 ch. to a Hickory 3 x on Maxwell's near Richardson's line thence S. 45 E. 13. 25 ch. to a Dogwood 3 x (down) thence N. 44 E. 3. 1/2 ch. to a Rock 3 x in the field, thence S. 20 E. 9. 22 ch. to stake Richardson's line, thence N. 66 E. 40. 40 ch. to a Rock 3 x thence N. 75 1/2 E. 55 to the beginning corner, Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances, to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident thereto appertaining; to have and to hold, all and singular the premises before mentioned, unto the said Hewlet Chapman, his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Hewlet Chapman, his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs, and against whomsoever, lawfully claiming, or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this 22nd day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred forty-five, and in the sixty-ninth of the Independence of the United States of America.
