Barrett of the state and District aforesaid do send greeting. Know ye that I the said Arthur Barrett for and in consideration of the natural love and affection which I have and bear unto my Grand Daughter Mary B. Barrett of the said state and District, and also for other good causes and considerations me hereunto moving have given and granted and by these presents do give grant and confirm unto the said Mary B. Barrett his heirs and assigns for ever the following property (to wit) one Negro boy Child Pleasant, To have and to hold all and singular the said Negro boy unto the said Mary B. Barrett and the heirs of her body forever to her own proper use and behoof to belong to and used by and be enjoyed only by the said Mary B. Barrett and the heirs of her body forever.

And I the said Arthur Barrett do warrant by these presents and for ever defend the said negro boy as above described unto the said Mary B. Barrett and the heirs of her body forever. in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this first day of October 1844.
