And I do hereby bind myself, my Heirs, Executors, Administrators and assigns, to warrant and forever defend all and singular the premises above mentioned unto my said sons William C. and Jeremiah Cleveland and their heirs forever against myself my heirs, Executors, Administrators and assigns and against all and every other person or persons whomsoever, claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
