Notice of Intention to become a Citizen.
To the Clerk of the Court of Greenville District, South Carolina.

In obedience to an Act of Congress, prescribing the mode of Naturalization, the undersigned Samuel Weeling respectfully reports to the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas for Greenville District, South Carolina, that he was born in Cockzburg in the Kingdom of Westemburg, Germany, about the Eleventh day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty one, and owing allegiance to King William the Second - that he sailed from Hamburde Grace in the month of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine for the United States - that he landed in New York in the month of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine and left for the State of Virginia in October 1839 that he left the State of Virginia in October 1840, for the State of South Carolina, with a view of residing in the United States That he is now Twenty Five years of age and is desirous of becoming a Citizen of the United States.
