Stokes was the last and highest bidder, to whom the said land was struck off for the sum of five hundred and eleven dollars. — Now this indorsement witnesseth, that in consideration of five hundred and eleven dollars, to me paid and secured to be paid, I have granted, bargain-ed, sold and released, and by these presents, do grant, bargain sell and release unto the said William A. Stokes and his heirs and assigns forever, all that tract of land situate in said district (except about three quarters of an acre sold to J. P. & C. Austin on the waters of Guilders creek of Enore River, containing two hundred acres, more or less, it being part of a tract of land originally granted to Isaac Putkins and hath such bounds, marks &c as follows viz) Beginning at a stake 3x on the original line, thence on said line due North 50 chs. to a stake 3x thence N 20 W. 4. 50 chs. to a Post oak 3x thence N. 60 E. 54. 50 chs. to a Post Oak 3x thence due South 69 chs. to a stake 3x thence a direct line to the beginning corner, it being the same tract of land sold and conveyed by John Blankenship to the said William Stokes decd. the 19th day of January A. D. 1815, with the appurtenances therunto belonging and all the estate, right, title, interest, claim or demand, which the said William Stokes deceased, at the time of his death had in or to the same. To have and to hold, the said tract of land, together with all and singular the premises, improvements and appurtenances to the said William A. Stokes and his heirs and assigns forever.
