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District and State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of Eight hundred and seventy five dollars and fifty cents to me paid William H. Hightower of the same State and District the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain, sell and release unto the said William H. Hightower his heirs and assigns for ever ten certain tracts situated in said District on both sides fall creek waters of North fork of Saluda river and on both sides of the Saluda turnpike road containing in both tracts by the plat hereunto described in C. Hightower deed Seven hundred acres to the same more or less it being of the tracts of land owned by the State of South Carolina and sold to John W. Hodges on the seventh day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty four and conveyed from Hodges to C. Hightower and both such boundaries as follows Beginning at a degraded corner, thence East 45 chains to a Chestnut, thence South 29 West 46 chains to a Spanish Oak thence North 12 chains to a Stake, thence North
