Know all men by these presents that I John S Styles  
 of the District of Greenville and State of South  
 Carolina for and in consideration of the natural  
 love and affection which I have to Sir Bennett

my brother in Law of District and State aforesaid, have given and granted and by  
 these presents do give and grant unto the said Sir Bennett his executors adm-  
 inistrators and assigns all that tract or parcel land containing one hundred and  
 twenty five acres, except a part lately sold to Thomas W Montgomery supposed to  
 be thirty acres. It being the same willed to me by my father Samuel Styles  
 by his last will and Testament. Known as the tract last where I now live reference  
 may be had to a plat of the same hereto annexed to have and to hold the said  
 premises with appurtenances unto him the said Sir Bennett his executors, administrators  
 assigns and I the said John S Styles for myself my heirs executors and administrators the  
 said premises unto the said Sir Bennett his executors, administrators and assigns  
 against the claim of me the said John S Styles my executors and administrators  
 and of every other person whomsoever, shall and will warrant and defend

Nevertheless it is the true intent and meaning of the parties to these  
 presents that the said John S Styles and his wife Emily Styles shall have full and  
 entire possession of all and singular the Lands, tenements and hereditaments to the  
 above premises during their natural lives free of any rent. It is stipulated and agreed  
 between the said parties to these presents, that whenever the saw mill on said premises is put  
 into operation said John S Styles is not to allow any other person except himself use  
 the same without approbation of the said Sir Bennett it is further agreed by and between  
 the said parties, that if the said Styles wishes to remove from the quarters said Bennett is  
 to endeavour to <sup>make</sup> sale of said premises and give said Styles the amount of the sale  
 of the same. Testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands and seals this the  
 first day of January in the year of Our Lord one Thousand eight hundred and forty  
 nine
