 District aforesaid and in consideration of
 the natural love and affection which I have for Jane McCulloch of the same place and
 for services which she has rendered me Heron given and granted and by these presents
 do give and grant unto the said Jane McCulloch her executors administrators and
 assigns a certain female negro slave named Harriett aged Twenty three years
 Together with her future offspring issue and increase

To Have and hold the said Negro Harriett her future offspring issue
 and increase unto the said Jane McCulloch her executors administrators and assigns
 forever and I the said William McCulloch for myself my heirs executors and admin-
 istrators the said Harriett do warrant unto the said Jane McCulloch her executors
 administrators and assigns against the claims of me the said William McCulloch
 my executors and administrators and of every other person whomsoever, shall and
 will warrant and lawfully defend

 To Joseph Cooper 64th News
 South Carolina } To all to whom these
 Presents shall come, I Messrs. Sayler
 Sheriff of Greenville District and State aforesaid
 send greeting Whereas by virtue of a Writ
 of Fieri Facias issued out of the Court of Common Pleas held for the District of
 Greenville tested the 24th day of March in the year of our Lord one Thousand eight
 hundred and forty nine at the suit of W. Starnate to me directed commanding me
 that of the Goods and chattels lands and tenements of Thos J Hawkins to levy the
 sum of One Hundred and twelve dollars with interest damage and costs I have
 seized and taken of the Lands and tenements of the said Thomas J Hawkins Seven by
 Five Acres more or less Situated and being in the District of Greenville lying on the westerly
 of Green River adjoining Lands of Mr Cooper Pleasant Meron and others

And whereas the said premises with their appurtenances since the seizure by
 me made by virtue of the said Writ of fieri facias before mentioned have been exposed to sale at
 public vendue and purchased by Joseph Cooper of the District and State aforesaid for the
 sum of One Hundred Dollars being the highest sum that was bid and therefor
