Together with all and singular the Rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any way incident or appertaining

To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said David Cannon his heirs and assigns forever I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to have and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said David Cannon his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs and against every other person or persons lawfully claiming or to claim the same in any part thereof
