This Indenture made the first day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty three between S. W. Courtes Esquire Commissioner of the Honorable Sec. & C. Equity of Green Hill District at Greenville Court House in the said State of the one part and Anne Satterfield of the other part

Whereas the said Anne Satterfield of the other part was about the Eleventh day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty one when she filed her Bill of complaint in the Court of Equity at Greenville Court House in the said State against Sarah Satterfield and John Satterfield William O. Satterfield Mary O. Satterfield and John P. Satterfield and William Canble and the cause being at first before the Honorable Court came on to be heard at Anne Town in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty one when the said Court after full hearing thereof and mature deliberation in the premises did Order saying and decree that Tracts of Land herein below described should be sold at public Auction by the Commissioners of the said Court on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in their Secretal Order as by reference thereto in the Registry of the said Court will appear And the said S. W. Courtes as Commissioner of the said Court after ^{having} duly advertised the Tracts of Land for sale by Public Auction on the 1st of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty three did then openly and publicly and according to the customs of auction sell and dispose of the said Tracts below described unto the said Anne Satterfield for the sum of Seven hundred and fifty Dollars the being at that price the highest bid for the same

And therefore it was ordered that the said Anne Satterfield should pay to the said S. W. Courtes the sum of Seven hundred and fifty Dollars
