Know all men by these presents that I Archibald Vaughan of the State and District of South Carolina have bargained and sold with Thomas P Brockman & Son the following property viz all my part of the present growing crop consisting of corn fodder cotton and eight head of cattle and six head of hogs and two of sheep and all my household and kitchen furniture and Bay Ware all of which property I have this day bargained sold and thereby release relinquish unto the said Brockman his heirs and assigns my adm<sup>r</sup> the Signer Seal<sup>d</sup> day and date below written

The conditions of the above Bill of sale or mortgage and Transfer is as follows that whereas the said Arch Vaughan stands indebted to Col Hoke in the sum of Some thirty eight dollars and 70 Cents to Thomas P Brockman and the P Brockman in and for one hundred and six dollars and thirty cents to this date and whereas the said Thomas P Brockman and several other Gentlemen are on the said Vaughan note to Hoke and the object of this Bill of conveyance is first to secure the payment of said note and secondly to secure the said Brockman in this debt Now know ye that if the said Vaughan shall well and truly pay off the above debts on or before the 1st day of November next then the above Bill of sale or conveyance will be null and void otherwise the said Thomas P Brockman may proceed forthwith to take into his possession all the aforesaid property and to sell the same by due notice say ten days in cash or on a credit as may seem most advisable to him the said Brockman and he wish to pay the note to Col Hoke and interest then to apply the residue to the payment of the debt due the said Thomas P Brockman and the P Brockman & Son and see only to the amount of all the aforesaid debts and it is moreover a part of this Transfer & Sale that the said Brockman is hereby authorized to enter the premises at any time before the 1st day of November next and seize and carry off any part or all the property above specified if in his opinion it is likely to be removed or otherwise destroyed and shall not be held liable for a trespass which without this distinct understanding might be regarded in law as a trespass any law or usage to the contrary Given under my hand and seal this 16th day of August 1834
