 all our Interest in a certain tract or parcel of land situate in  
 said District on the waters of North Saluda River it being a tract  
 or parcel of Land formerly Owned by John Shelton deceased and adjo  
 ing lands Owned by Adam Cox William Lynch and others the aforsaid  
 Tract of Land contains by estimation One hundred acres more or less  
 and our Interest being One distributive share of said Land together  
 with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances  
 to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appurtenant  
 To have and to hold all and singular the said premises unto the said  
 John H. Goodwin his heirs and assigns for ever and we do hereby  
 bind our selves our heirs executors administrators to warrant and  
 forever defend all and singular the aforsaid premises unto the said
