Know all men by these presents that I Mary Bridwell of Greenville District in the State aforesaid in consideration of the natural love and affection which I bear to William Bridwell and also in consideration of the sum of ten dollars to me paid by the said William Bridwell of Greenville District in the State aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said William Bridwell all that piece parcel and tract of land I purchased from Joseph McClennon by deed bearing date the third day of September 1857 said tract containing six acres more or less lying and being in Greenville District and State aforesaid which may be and is thus described to wit. Said land lying bounded North and South by lands of John Cooper East and west by lands of Ann Saterfield. Said Land also lying North of what is known and called the Satterfield Ford Road. Having for its South Corner on said Road a Black Sack running thence to a White Oak on the Satterfield line for its North corner thence to a Post Oak corner on said line and thence to a Red Oak on the same line being the same tract I now live on. Provided however that I reserve to my self the free use and undisturbed knowledge of occupancy and the entire control of the said tract during my natural life and at my death this conveyance is to become effective together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said William Bridwell his heirs and assigns forever. and I do hereby bind my self my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said William Bridwell his heirs and assigns against me and my heirs or against any person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
