have for and in consideration of the sum of One thousand and fifty dollars to me in hand paid by Thomas Barton and William Barton of the State and District aforesaid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell release convey and confirm unto the said Thomas and William Barton all that Plantation tract or parcel of Land containing two hundred and fifty five Acres more or less situate lying and being in the State and District aforesaid extending from the East side of the Sink hole fork of Syger River to the West side of Bartons fork of said River Beginning on a stone on the Road running South fifty five West thirty seven chains and fifty links to a stake near a Spring thence South six and a half West eight chains to an oak on the Branch thence North seventy West five chains to the creek of the branch thence up the branch North eighty one and a half West forty five chains to a pine on the top of the mountain thence South eighty two and a half West sixteen chains to a chestnut near the path in the gap of the mountain thence North fifty six and a half West five chains to a white oak thence North twenty five and three fourths East ten chains and twenty five links to a dog wood near a branch thence South eighty four and a half East twenty six chains and ninety links to a chestnut an old corner thence North seven East twelve chains and ninety links to a chestnut Robertsons corner thence South eighty and fourth East twenty chains and fifty links to a stake (and its ten chains from the chestnut to a station tree a chestnut oak on the same line) thence South forty West forty three links to a stake supposed to be the Davis corner thence South eighty seven and three fourths East five chains and thirty four links to a lowerwood thence North fifteen East twenty eight chains to a stone joining Pitmans land thence East ten chains and fifteen links to a white oak near the House thence North fifteen West three chains and fifty links to a stake thence North one and a half East twelve chains and ten links to a chestnut at Pitmans land thence North
